Greyhounds...

- are friendly, gentle dogs with an elegance like no other breed
- thrive on human companionship, love to be the center of attention and make wonderful household pets
- are kennel trained, so they take to housebreaking quickly, with a little TLC and patience
- come in all sizes, colors and ages. They average between 50 and 85 pounds and have a life expectancy of 12 to 14 years or more
- require little exercise, but a nice walk three to four times a week will make them happy.

 Remember they've lived in crates most of their lives, so they really are 45 MPH couch potatoes!
- are tolerant of children, preferring to walk away when they've had enough;
- are very social
- are not used to cats, so extra time and patience may be required
- require routine visits to the vet and good dental hygiene
- must always be kept on a leash when outside a fenced area since they are sight hounds and can run faster than you!
- CANNOT live as outside dogs!
- do not have the normal doggie odor and shed little
- will love you unconditionally







Adoptinga

GALT spends an average of \$500 to care for and prepare each healthy greyhound for adoption. Dogs with significant medical problems cost much more.

GALT's non-refundable tax deductible adoption donation fee is \$350 for all Greyhounds under 7 years, \$275 for GALT Cheerleaders, ages 7, 8 and 9, and \$225 for GALT seniors, age 10 and over.

The adoption donation includes:

- Neuter/spay
- All vaccinations (DHLPP, Bordetella, Leptosporidia, & Rabies)
- A CBC (complete blood count with serum chemistry panel)
- A tick-borne disease panel (performed by Protatek Lab*)
- Heartworm test
- Dental cleaning
- A special greyhound collar and leash
- An adoption package
- * HomeAgain® Microchipping

*This test detects Ehrlichia canis, Babesia canis, Rocky Mountain Spotted Fever & Lyme, all diseases prevalent in Texas transmitted from a tick bite. Proper treatment will eliminate these diseases; however, if the greyhound is not tested & treated as necessary, the diseases can go undetected for years manifesting themselves as different illnesses causing difficult, extensive & costly treatment.

Greyhound

- A \$75 deposit is required with submission of the application (\$50 of which is refundable, and \$25 of which is non-refundable). The remaining \$275, \$200 or (\$150 senior) adoption donation is due when the Greyhound is delivered to the adopter.
